



Linear Equation The look of more well-defined makeup is changing the idea of what's "basic" to a cosmetics wardrobe. A must now: liners. For eyes, felt-tip applicator pens and cake liners are showing up in more colors, giving quicker-than-ever finish. Lip pencils, too, are

> staying power. Here's how to use which ones when: For day, fresh appeal comes from eye pencils in shades of violet, brown and blue (YSL's Kohl Eyeliner Pencil, left). Softly blend the line for a contour-plus-shadow effect.

fast replacing traditional lipsticks for their creamy feel and longer

 Use cake liners for evening. Dot pigment at the base of the lash first, stroke a thicker band of color on top for emphasis.

 Achieve two very different looks with a single eyeliner pen. For subtle sophistication: a sweep of espresso brown on the upper lid. More dramatic glamour comes from lining both top and bottom lids; extend the line upward, about a half-inch outside the eye.

 Gently muted shades of pink, peach and rose are the popular choices in lip pencils. The modern approach: Define parts of the lip only—the Cupid's Bow, for example.

Cult Classic Jerry Hall, Mick Jagger, Princess Diana, Sting—the list of celebrities devoted to Erno Laszlo's products reads like a 20th-century who's who of the fashionable and beautiful. The reason: Laszlo's nononsense skincare regimens are tailor-made to suit individual complexion needs. The water-based system for oily skin, for example, relies on thorough soap-andwater cleansing with the infamous black Sea Mud soap; lots of water splashes afterward provide surface hydration and synergistic lotions and creams work to control surface oil. The best part—and why celebs keep coming back for more-the programs can easily be finetuned to combat minute changes in skin behavior.
